Jellyfish has no heart, no blood, or even a brain. Surprisingly, they are the ultimate survivors. They have survived five mass extinctions and are some of the most common predators in the ocean. And if their history is any indication, jellyfish may outlive us as well.

2. Whales can speak?

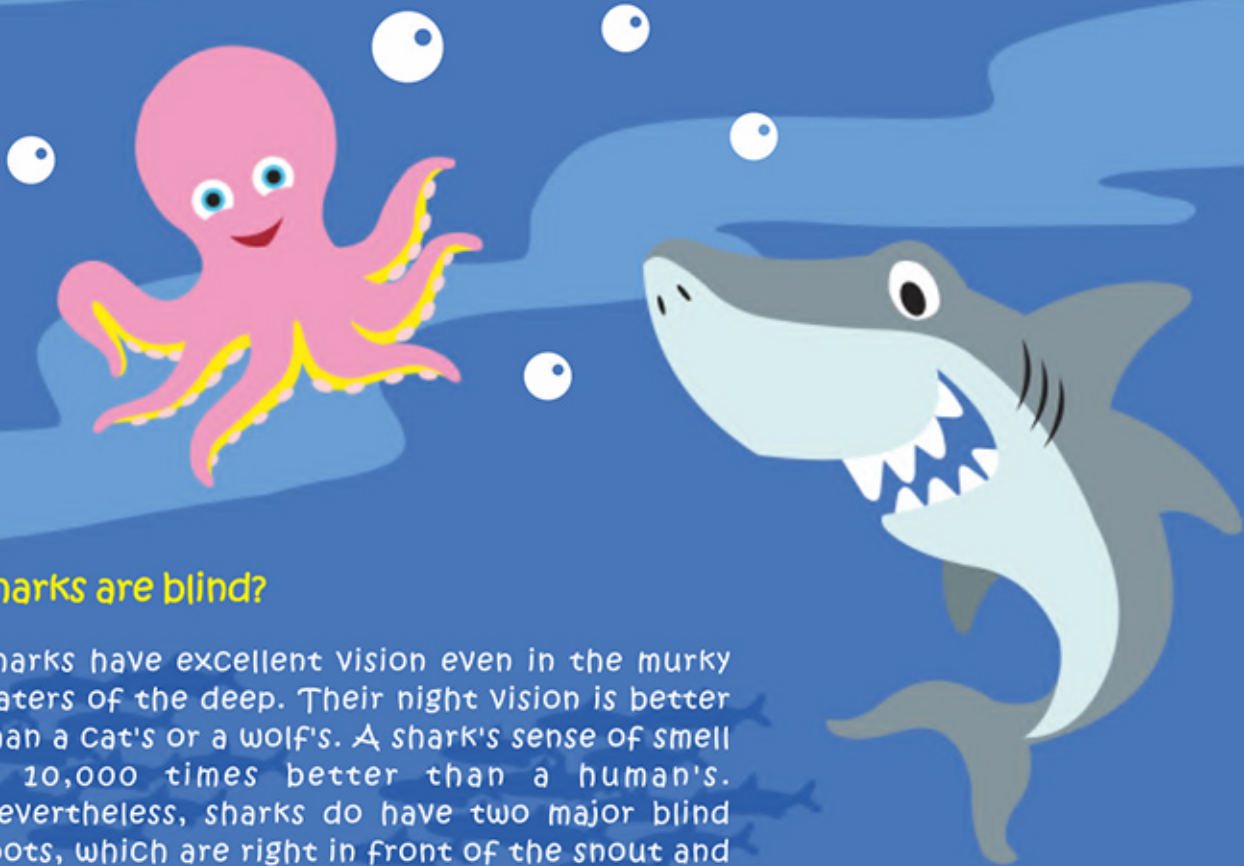
Killer Whales are smart, they can and they do speak! NOC was a Beluga whale who made human-like vocalizations. He was captured by Inuit hunters in 1977 and lived in captivity until 1999. In 1984, researchers from the National Marine Mammal Foundation discovered his unusual ability to mimic the rhythm and tone of human speech.

In 2014, it was even found that orcas that were socialized with bottlenose dolphins started making similar sounds as the dolphins, with more clicks and fewer longer calls, according to a study by University of San Diego graduate.



3. An octopus's speed of travel never exceeds that of the surrounding waves?

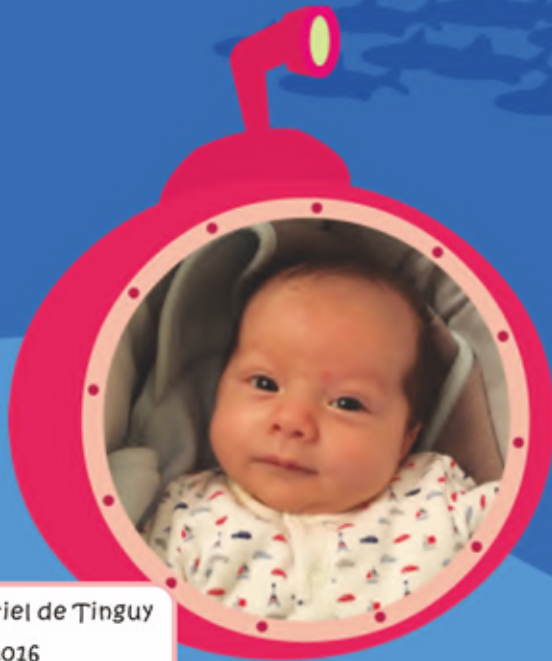
It's true! Octopus is very flexible. It employs amazing camouflaging talents i.e. changing color, shape, and even its texture, pattern and brightness to blend in to its surroundings.



4. Sharks are blind?

Sharks have excellent vision even in the murky waters of the deep. Their night vision is better than a cat's or a wolf's. A shark's sense of smell is 10,000 times better than a human's. Nevertheless, sharks do have two major blind spots, which are right in front of the snout and right behind the head, and because sharks can only see about 50 feet (15 meters) ahead, the sense of sight is really only important to a shark once it has closed in on its prey.
